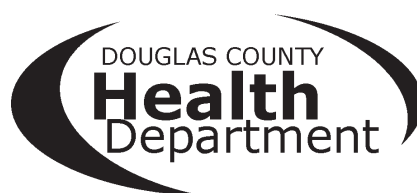


Attention Parents

Infant cold medicines voluntarily recalled because of the potential for misuse

This does not affect children two years of age and older

- The FDA has said that over-the-counter cough and cold products should not be used to treat infants and children less than two years of age because serious side effects can happen.
- The products sometimes cause death, convulsions, rapid heart rates and decreased levels of consciousness.
- The announcement does not include the FDA's final recommendation on over-the-counter cough and cold medicines for children from two to 11 years of age. The agency is continuing to review the products for use with children in that age group.
- Many of the products were recalled by the manufacturers last fall. Some of those products are shown below.
