Tummies can be filled at dozens of locations around the metro area this summer thanks to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Summer Food Service Program.

The USDA Summer Food Service Program offers a free healthy breakfast and lunch at more than 80 locations in Douglas and Sarpy counties. Anyone, 18 and younger, is eligible to participate.

The United States Department of Agriculture's Summer Food Service Program partners include Bellevue Public Schools, Holy Name School, the Omaha Housing Authority, the Omaha Public Schools, the Papillion-La Vista School District, and Westside Community Schools.
